St. John the Baptist School Summer Reading Requirements for students Entering Grade 3

"Kindergarten through third grade children learn to read. From third grade on they read to learn. In second and third grade, reading instruction focuses on accuracy, fluency and comprehension.

Once your child learns to read, don't drop your read-aloud routine at home. The reality is that until at least middle school, reading aloud is important. That's when your child's reading level begins to match his vocabulary level - but too many families have stopped reading aloud by this time.

Enjoy listening to your child <u>read to you</u> every day! Afterwards, your child may like to hear you read. Share books at your child's <u>listening</u> level, which is typically two years higher than his/her <u>reading</u> level. Model what good reading sounds like, and expand your child's vocabulary and knowledge. Enjoy discussing more complicated stories and ideas. You can read about topics your child may not choose to read on his own. Reading with your child shouldn't stop just because your child can read on his own...ideally, reading together will continue to be an enjoyable and valuable part of your relationship."* (From The Children's Reading Foundation, please visit the website to learn more!) Please help your child choose books that are at his/her level. If you find a book that is not on the list, but at your child's level, allow them to read it. Students should read at least 15 to 20 minutes **each day**. This will get them into the habit of reading **every day**.
